Against Good Government

- Voted to allow bureaucrats to set fees without legislative approval (HB1524)
- Voted to allow many state employees to be classified as "supervisor" even if they don't supervise anyone (HB1122)
- Voted to provide free health insurance to childless, able-bodied adults (HB1696)
- Voted against requiring police to return recovered stolen property back to its rightful owner in a timely fashion (HB1125)
- Voted against truth and transparency in the NH House's official records ()

Against Good Health

- Voted to prohibit people from buying health insurance from out of state (HB128)
- Voted to discourage creation of state-of-the-art medical facilities (SB481)

Against Life

- Voted against protecting the life of an infant born alive during an intended abortion (HB1627)
- Voted against limiting abortions when the fetus is capable of experiencing pain (HB1328)
- Voted against protecting women's health by licensing abortion clinics (HB1399)
- Voted against the Women's Health Defense Act, which would restrict abortions after the 20th week (HB1636)
- Voted to allow buying, selling, and experimenting on unborn infants or bodily remains resulting from abortion (HB1663)
- Voted to allow public funds to pay for abortions that are not necessary to save the life of the mother (HB1684)
- Voted to study assisted suicide and euthanasia (SB426)

Against Parents

- Voted for a guilty-until-proven-innocent definition of child neglect (SB515)

Against Self-defense

- Voted against allowing members of the national guard to defend themselves while on base (HB1288)
- Voted to allow some public entities to violate state law regarding firearms (HB1314)
- Voted to retain vague language about who may lawfully carry a firearm (HB1400)
- Voted against the right of law-abiding citizens to carry a weapon in a vehicle (HB1645)

More bad votes

- Voted to allow the commissioner of insurance to secretly take over any private insurance company (SB110)
- Voted to eliminate a requirement that healthy people must work to receive free health insurance (HB1696)
- Voted for higher cost electricity (HB1374)
- Voted to replace the fire code with one that has not yet stood the test of time (HB427)
